

MASTER OF ACCOUNTING

If your undergraduate accounting degree has left you wanting advanced knowledge and expertise across the field, this is your opportunity.

In this master's degree, you'll gain the skills to successfully operate as a specialist in the accounting profession. You'll combine research with practical experience, and cover the latest applications to further develop your accounting expertise.

Course structure

The course consists of three parts. Part A. Advanced preparatory studies, Part B. Mastery knowledge and Part C. Application studies. All students complete Part B. Depending upon your prior qualifications, you may receive credit for Part A or Part C or a combination of both.

Entry requirements

An Australian bachelor's degree, or equivalent qualification with a Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of 65 per cent or an equivalent GPA as determined by the School. You'll be ranked and selected based on your entire academic record.

Depending upon your prior qualifications and experience you may be eligible for entry credit, which reduces the duration. You'll need to prepare a candidate statement that shows you have the motivation and academic skills to successfully complete the program.

- 2. Even if you're eligible for entry credit you do not need to take it. You may apply for and complete the longer duration.
- Professional accounting programs include: Chartered Accountants Program of Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CA ANZ); CPA Program of CPA Australia; IPA Program of the Institute of Public Accountants (IPA); Professional Level of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA).

- * If you complete this 12-point unit as your capstone experience you will only need to complete 18 points for Part C. This also means you will not be able to complete the research pathway in Part C.
